CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION</p> <p>The Board shall provide a program of career and technical education in order to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Prepare students for employment as skilled workers or technicians in recognized, new and emerging occupations.</li> <li>2. Prepare students for enrollment in postsecondary education programs.</li> <li>3. Assist students in choosing career pathways.</li> </ol> <p>The Board shall ensure that all students and parents/guardians are informed of the student's rights to participate in career and technical education programs and courses and that students with disabilities enrolled in such programs are entitled to services under state and federal laws and regulations.</p> <p>All students participating in career and technical programs sponsored or supervised by the Board shall be considered regularly enrolled in district schools and shall be subject to Board policies and district administrative regulations and rules.</p> <p>The Board shall support a program of career and technical education which may include:</p> <p>District students attending Berks Career &amp; Technology Center for participation in a cooperative program of career development.</p> <p>Students and parents/guardians shall be informed that admission to career and technical education programs is accessible to regularly enrolled district students, in accordance with established criteria for attendance.</p>

Sec. 6311 Pol. 806</p>	<p><i>Arrest or Conviction Reporting Requirements –</i></p> <p>An identified adult shall notify the employer, in writing, within seventy-two (72) hours of the occurrence, of an arrest or conviction required to be reported by law.</p> <p>An identified adult shall also report to the employer, within seventy-two (72) hours of notification, that s/he has been listed as a perpetrator in the Statewide database, in accordance with the Child Protective Services Law.</p> <p>Failure to accurately report such occurrences may subject the identified adult to disciplinary action up to and including termination of employment and criminal prosecution.</p> <p>The employer shall immediately require an identified adult to submit new certifications when there is a reasonable belief that the identified adult was arrested for or has been convicted of an offense required to be reported by law, was named as a perpetrator in a founded or indicated report, or has provided written notice of such occurrence.</p> <p>If the employer receives notice of such occurrences from either the adult or a third party, the employer shall immediately report that information to the Superintendent or designee in writing.</p> <p><i>Child Abuse Reporting –</i></p> <p>Identified adults who have reasonable cause to suspect that a child is the victim of child abuse shall make a report of suspected child abuse in accordance with the Child Protective Services Law.</p> <p>References:</p> <p>School Code – 24 P.S.
